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History of Dhamdhama Anchalik College

Dhamdhama Anchalik College, established in the year 1988 at the initiative of the enthusiastic people of the locality was a long cherished dream of the people of this remote area. Dhamdhama Anchalik College has successfully completed 25 years of its glorious existence and has been provincialised under Higher Education of Goverment of Assam from January, 2021. Since its inception, the institution is imparting Higher Education to the economically backward classes of this locality, especially belonging to SC and ST communities. The college has greatly contributed to the academic and cultural atmosphere of the locality by its consistent effort and performance. The untiring effort of the dedicated teachers and the Management has turned the College into a leading institution of Nalbari District.

Location:

The College is situated on the bank of rivulet Cheng, beside the weekly market of Dhamdhama. The rivulet, Cheng, a tributary of river Burhadia, has surrounded three quarters of the area of the college. The college is situated almost 13 kilometers away from the district head quarter of Nalbari District, hardly 200 meters away from Dhamdhama Bus Stand and easily approachable from all sides.

Vision



General Rules of Admission and Eligibility:

The admission to the college course will be subject to the following:

- 1. Admissions must be taken in person, after submission of online application form in the prescribed admission portal & on the online payment of the fees.
- 2. All admissions will be provisional and subject to confirmation by the Principal and approval by the University.
- 3. The Departmental seats for Honours (Major) Course are available as per the Reservation Policy of Government of Assam. The availability of seats for Honours Course against each Departments are as follows-

- 5. At the time of admission, the following documents and certificates shall have to be produced:
 - (a) Original statement of marks with the certified copy of H.S.L.C. onwards.
 - (b) Passing certificate and its certified copy. Certificate indicating the date of birth such as school leaving certificate or H.S.L.C. Certificate.
 - (c) In case of a student migrating from another University or Board, an eligibility certificate from this University.
 - (d) Income certificate (For Fee-waiver admission) must be produce during the admission time issued by their respective Circle Officer as per Government Guidelines.

Rules of College Discipline:

Students admitted to Dhamdhama Anchalik College must abide by all rules and regulations as directed by the governing body and college authority.

Violation of rules, irregular attendance, showing disrespect to the teachers and staff members, adopting unfair means during examination etc., will be regarded as offence. Students irregular in attending classes will be regarded as non-collegiate or may be debarred from appearing in the examination.

- * Every student of this college shall abide by the rules of college discipline. Every student seeking admission to this College shall be required to fill an application for admission personally in his/her own handwriting.
- * A student also makes a declaration to the following effect. "I hereby submit to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Principal and the other officers and the authorities of the College, and shall observe abide by

the rules made by the Vice-Chancellor of the affiliating university in that behalf, and also by the rules made by the Principal of the college."

- * Student must observe complete silence in the college premises. They must not loiter in the garden, passage and corridors after the classes have begun. They must read quietly in the library and spend their spare time in such a way, as not to cause any interference with the work of others. Absolute silence must be observed in the library as well as in the class-rooms.
- * The students should be punctual in attendance and must be in his/her seat at the commencement of lectures.
- * No Society or association of the students will be formed without the previous written permission of the Principal.
- * All the departments of the college will work according to rules, made by the Principal in that behalf from time to time.
- * Students must keep their terms strictly in accordance with the rules of the University authorities for grant of terms. Terms shall not be granted in case of students, who are defaulter in attendance, tutorials, test and fees etc.
- * Every student of the college must have an Identity Card. He/She should always carry it with him/her in and out of the college and should produce it whenever called upon to do so by the relevant authorities. This card shall be produced at the time of examination by every candidate for the Examination.
- * The students are bound by all the rules and regulations made by the college from time to time. Any matter not expressly provided for in these rules shall vest at the absolute discretion of the Principal who also reserves the right of modifying of these rules as and when felt necessary.
- * To safeguard its ideals of character and personal behaviour the college reserves the right to expel any student at any time for any reason deemed sufficient by the Principal as misbehavior in the campus of the institute
- * The Principal reserves the right to remove from the rolls the name of any student for failure to pay the Institute dues in time.
- * Students are required to read the notices put up on the notice boards of the college. The college shall not accept any responsibility for any loss/ damage incurred by a student owing to his/her failure to read the notice in time.
- * Smoking, chewing pans-gutkha, drinking (alcohol) and use of 'Drugs' are strictly prohibited in the premises of the college.
- * Anyone found indulging in ragging in any form within or outside the college shall be instantly expelled from the college.
- * Students are required to show due regard for the rights and property of the Institute. Any students found guilty of tampering/damaging the property fixtures, equipment, books, and buildings, vehicles etc. of the college shall be punishable and might be liable for expulsion from the Institute.

College Dress Code:

Dhamdhama Anchalik College has introduced its own dress code by way of the College uniform, comprising the following:

- 1. Brown (dark coffee) pant and white shirt for boys.
- 2. White kameez, brown (dark coffee) salwar and brown (dark coffee) dupatta for girls.
- 3. Bodo traditional dress code for girls: Brown (dark coffee) *dokhna*, white *kameez* and brown (dark coffee) *dopatta*.
- 4. Assamese traditional dress code for girls: Brown Mekhela, brown (dark coffee) kameez and white chadar.

Courses of Study (Arts):

Four-year Undergraduate Programme:

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC's Curricular Framework, published in November 2022. The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS). Though,

the FYUGP is basically a CBCS, it is radically different from the courses running under CBCS. Namely, it does not differentiate between so-called Honours and Pass courses existing under CBCS. Basically, the FYUGP is based on the system of education under Liberal Arts.

Salient features

Bachelor's Course under the FYUGP of NEP is different in the following ways-

Duration

Under the NEP's FYUGP; it is a 4-year degree programme.

• Exits & Entries

In the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

• Honours and Major

In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 year.

Progression

If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, s/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree. Under CBCS, there were no such pathways.

• Progression to Doctoral Studies

Once a student takes admission into a Master's programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor's programme or after FYUGP, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master's programme.

First Year (Semester I & II)

In the first year, one studies three different core subjects – one paper of each subjects per semester. Besides, one needs to study a host of common subjects that have designed as per UGC's Curricular Framework.

Second Year (Semester III & IV)

Semester III

In the third semester, one will usually continue with the same core subjects that have already been chosen in the first year and again study some common subjects. In the third semester, one will also take a step forward to study the favorite subject by declaring one of the core subjects as a Major subject and other two as Minors. However, the structure of the programme remains same as in first & second semesters.

N.B. - If you would like to change a Minor subjects in the third semester, you can change with the following limitations:

- 1. You will be able to change a subject, provided the new subject can accommodate you. This can be a problem with science subjects as they need to ensure laboratory space for each student.
- 2. Besides, as you have already abandoned the first year time studying a subject which you no longer want to continue, you will need to use your open core credits to compensate for the new subject.

Semester IV

From Semester IV onwards, one will primarily study the Major subject by taking at least four papers, some of which may be elective depending on the subject concerned.

As the programme structure in the third semester is same as the first & second semesters, one will have the option of changing the Major in fourth semester to any one of the other two Minors as well, even if one has already declared a Major in the third semester. However this has the condition that the new

Major subject of choice has vacancy.

• Third Year

In the third year, one will continue to study the Major subject to complete a full set of 15 papers in Majors.

• Fourth Year

If one intends to progress to the fourth year, s/he will be devoting the time in studying advanced courses which will be at the level of initial Master's degree papers. Besides, one will also have the opportunity of engaging into research work with the faculty members.

Besides the above, there are some more unique features of the FYUGP. They are

• Open Core Credits

From fourth to sixth semester, one will have time for 4 optional open core credits per semester, which one can utilize to study either of the Major or two Minors. They can also come handy, if one had changed a Minor subject in between.

• Double Major

If a student is ready to do some more hard work, s/he can take some extra online courses (from designated sources only) related to the Minors and can then convert one of the Minors to a second Major by the time one completes 3 / 4 years of study. This is over and above the first Major. In this case, one will have a Bachelor's Degree with Double Major.

FYUGP Degrees & Course Structures

The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme — (i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and (ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline. The word stream here refers to Arts, Science, Commerce, and Management. In case of a degree in a stream, the student studies a multitude of different subjects, usually mixing different disciplines, which leads to a truly multidisciplinary degree. While in case of a degree in a discipline, the student is confined to a certain sets of disciplines. However, in both cases, the student studies equal number of courses (i.e. papers) — so there is no weightage of any kind to either of the two types of degrees.

For both the types of degree programmes, course-wise, the whole FYUGP is divided into two parts — (i) Core Courses and (ii) Common Courses. The minimum credit allocation for a 3-year programme is 84 credits in Core Courses and 36 credits in Common Courses, which comes to a total of minimum 120 credits for a 3-year programme. With the fourth year, the minimum credit requirement becomes 160. A student can however earn up to a maximum of 132 credits in a 3-year programme and 176 by the fourth year.

Core Courses

The Core Courses determine the ultimate degree, diploma, or certificate a student will earn at the end of third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively. The performance in the Core Courses will also determine the grade of the student in the final examinations. Total minimum credit requirement is 84 for the Core Courses, which translates to 21 courses (i.e. papers) with a credit allocation of 4 per course (paper). A student will need to study at least three Core subjects. The Core Courses have to be chosen among a plethora of subjects offered (see the section on Subject Details) for both the types of degrees, respectively. In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, the components of the Core Courses are Major and / or Minors, while in case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline, there are no Majors and Minors.

Major and Minors

In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, a student either chooses a Major and Minors or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case, a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year. Please see the examples that we have given in this booklet. A Major course MUST carry a minimum credit of 60 and a Minor course should carry a minimum credit of 12. Usually, for majority of the students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and two Minors.

Common courses

The common courses are to be studied by all students alike and all-together they carry total credits of 36 over a 3-year period. These courses are further divided into five (5) subcategories, as described below-

Multi-disciplinary Courses

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects — (i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv)Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The levels of these courses are of Class XII. Each student need to take at any three papers, each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

N.B. - A student CANNOT choose a multidisciplinary subject, if s/he has already studied that subject during Class XI-XII. Also the subject of these courses MUST not be among the Core Subjects the student has already chosen.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication).

Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each – one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. Both these courses are further divided into two 2-credit courses each. The English Communication course is to be completed during Semesters 1-2 and the MIL course is to be completed during Semesters 5-6.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits during Semesters 1-3.

Value Added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups — (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6. Each student will have to take any three courses, each of 2-credit, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2, & 4. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

Internship

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

*N.B. - Subjects under different disciplines may be changed as per notification from Gauhati University.

Eligibility:

Passed in Higher Secondary or Equivalent (10+2 Standard)

Examinations:

Continuous assessment of the student is done by the department through regular tests, sessional examination, seminars, projects and assignments. The marks secured by the students in these assessments are taken into consideration at the time of sending up the students for the final examination. The Examination Committee's decision inthis regard is final and binding. Job training, projects, study tours and field work are essential requirements of a number of degree programmes.

Examination Rules:

- 1. All students must appear in all the examinations conducted by the college during an academic year.
- 2. Any student who is unwell may be permitted to avail of the sick room facility during an examination.
- 3. The following examinations are conducted by the college during an academic year:

Class Examinations:

B. A. Semester I, II, III, IV, V & VI

Sessional Examinations, as per GU guideline.

- 4. For the B.A. course eligibility for appearing in the final Examinations will be decided on the basis of their regularity in the classes and performance in the tests conducted by the concerned department with percentage of attendance.
- 5. For all College examinations, pass marks, as laid down by Gauhati University will be taken as the standard. Relaxation, if any, will be decided by the examination Committee for the finalization of the result of the Test examination.

Regulation of B.A. Semester System & With Choice Based Credit and Grading System:

- 1. B.A. shall be of 8th Semesters covering fourth Calendar year. The schedule will be start as per UGC Notification.
- 2. Students' performance should be monitored throughout the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the Students' performances in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following:

Internal Evaluation: 20% Marks (In some cases it may be change as

per G.U. Guidelines)

External Evaluation: 80% Marks (In some cases it may be change as

per G.U. Guidelines)

- 3. Internal Evaluation should be based on one sessional examinations, home assignments, seminars and library work in each Semester.
- 4. External Evaluation should be through a final examination at the end of the Semester.
- 5. The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and that in each practical paper is 40%
- 5. In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
- 6. A student who could not appear or failed in any Semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows.
 - (a) First Semester with the regular Third Semester examination.
 - (b) Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester examination.
 - (c) Third Semester with the regular Fifth Semester examination.
 - (d) Fourth Semester with the regular Sixth Semester examination.
- 7. A student may be allowed to "repeat" any one of the theory papers in the First, Second and Third Semester.
- 8. No "repeat" shall be allowed in the practical examination in any Semester.
- 9. A student must pass all his Semester examinations, including "repeat" within Six years from the date of

10.	admission to the First Semester course. Since the Semester involves continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.			
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Also available

Regular Courses in BCA (3years, 6 Semester) and PGDCA (1st year, 2 Semester) under Gauhati University

Grant of Terms:

Admission to each academic year is a fresh one. The question of grant of term will be decided on the basis of the following factors:

- Attendance in general classes
- Attendance in tutorial classes
- * Performance at sessional examination/ workshop/ seminar/ project.
- * Test examinations, and University Examinations.
- * General conduct of the student in the class and outside the class.
- * Full payment of all fees due.

Academic Session:

The academic session of the college usually begins in July.

Medium of Instructions:

The medium of instruction is Assamese and English in both pass courses and Major courses.

Hostel:

The College has one girls' hostel which is Dhamdhama Anchalik College Women Hostel funded by University Grants Commission.

It is situated around the college campus. Hostel seats are allotted at the time of admission. Hostels remain closed during summer and puja vacation. Conduct in the hostel is governed by the Dhamdhama Anchalik College hostel rules.

Rules and Regulations for hostel border:

- 1. A Student once admitted will have to pay seat rent for the entire session even if she leaves the hostel midway through the session.
- 2. Boarder can leave for home twice a month with prior consent of the parents/ guardian.
- 3. Ragging in all forms is strictly prohibited.
- 4. Students taking coaching classes must take the permission of the superintendent in writing.
- 5. No boarder should disturb the other during the study hours.
- 6. Attendance during collective prayer is mandatory.
- 7. Boarders are to maintain cleanliness in the hostel compound.
- 8. A boarder must pay at least 15 days mess dues even if she had absent in the concerned month.
- 9. Use of mobile phone:

Mobile phone use is allowed in the hostel with the following conditions:

- (i) Mobile phones can be used for essential communications only.
- (ii) Use of mobile phones during study hours is strictly prohibited.
- (iii) The Hostel Warden can check and verify mobile phone when required.
- (iv) If complaint is received regarding misuse of mobile phone, the warden is authorized to seize the device.
- 9. No student will be allowed to stay in local guardian's residence without prior permission of the parents/ legal guardian.
- 10. Visitors are allowed only on Sundays during either from 9 A.M. to 12 P.M. or from 2 P.M. to 4 P.M.

Hostel Seats: 42

Hospital Facility:

Dhamdhama Anchalik College has hospital facility for all the students, particularly for those residing in hostel.

Identity Card:

A non-transferable Identity Card is issued to each student at the time of admission. The card containing relevantinformation of the holder, along with a recent passport-size photograph, is duly endorsed by the Principal. Identity Cards are issued annually. Old Identity Cards are to be surrendered at the end of each academic year for renewal. The Identity Card is to be brought to the college every day and is to be produced whenever asked for.

Scholarship:

The following scholarships are sponsored by the State and Central Govt.

1. SC/ST Scholarship. 2. OBC/MOBC Scholarship. 3. UGC Ishan Uday Merit Scholarship.

Students' AID Fund:

Under this scheme, the college gives financial help to the students belonging to lower income group, for purchasing books, payment of examination fees etc. Good behaviour, regularity in attendance, performance in the examination is taken into consideration in this matter. Moreover the Principal has the right to recover such payment in case the above mentioned conditions are later found to be false or unsatisfactory.

Students' Union Body:

Students' Union is the general body of students of the college. Its membership is compulsory for every student. The office bearers of the union are elected annually. The Constitution of the Students' Union is available in the College Website and Library.

College Magazine:

Dhamdhama Anchalik College *Alochani* is the Multi-lingual College magazine. It has been published annually.

Wall Magazine:

The Wall Magazine entitled 'Shristi' has been published monthly by the College Literary Forum. Moreover Wall Magazines are published by Bodo, English, Philosophy, Economics, Assamese, Political Science Education & History, Departments under the titles 'Thunlai Bidam', 'Rhythm', 'Sophia' 'The Time', 'Pratyasha', 'Bipanchee' and 'Jyanam' 'Fengua' respectively.

Canteen:

The College Canteen remains open from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. It is under supervision of Management Committee of the college.

Award:

Awards are conferred to the candidates who secure highest position in G.U. final Examination.

Extra-Curricular Activities:

The College considers the extension work as the third dimension of the Institution and takes it to be as important as the other two dimensions, the research and teaching functions from the point of view of social usefulness and accountability. Hence, extension programme has been taken up out of its own fund. Several co-curricular and extra-curricular activities had helped several of our students to achieve excellence in different levels. To enable the students to blossom as full-fledged leaders to meet the requirement, a social and just society, extra care is being taken to deliver personality development lectures, workshops and seminars. In fact, the lecture series being conducted by the College has achieved a distinction of its own. Our staff has always offered enlightened and dynamic leadership to the student community.

Library:

The College has an excellent and a well-stocked library. Apart from books, both prescribed and recommended by the University, the College Library has number of journals and general periodicals.

General Reading Room Section:

There is a general reading room where books, newspapers and magazines are available. The students can avail of this facility on all working days from 9.00 a.m. to 3.00 p.m.

Home Reading Sections:

Text books can be issued for home-reading to students (subject to the availability of books). A student is allowed to take one book at a time and keep it for a maximum period of one week. The Home Reading section of library is generally open from 10.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m.

N.C.C. GIRLS (NATIONAL CADET CORPS):

The girls division of the NCC in Indian was started in July 1949 and Girls NCC in Dhamdhama Anchalik College comes in to existence in the year 2018. It is running under 60 Assam Girls Battalion NCC. Panjabari, Guwahati-37. Principal Dr. Gautam Chandra Das has taken the charge of ANO and Assistant Professor, Rupanjali Boro has taken the charge of CTO (Care Taker Officer) in the year 2018 and in presently Geetima Bhagabati is the charge of cadet crops. She has been running the Girls NCC in the college. The college has a total strength of 60 NCC Cadets under 60 Assam girls Battalion NCC.

The NCC aims at developing character comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of Adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. ABOUT:

Bodo (□□□□) also called Boro (□□'), is a Sino-Tibetan language, primarily spoken by the Boro people of North-east India, Nepal and Bengal; basically BTR region and some corners of different districts of Assam. It is the official language of the Bodoland autonomous region and a co-official language of the state of Assam in India.
