Paper 9: ENG-HC-4026 British Romantic Literature

C.O-I: This course aims to introduce students to the Romantic period in English literature, a period of lasting importance, since it serves as a critical link between the Enlightenment and Modernist literature.

C.O-II: To familiarise the students with the literature of the Romantic period.

C.O.-III: To acquaint the students with the canonical poems and prose those constitute the core of literature of the age.

C.O-IV: To provide an overview of women literary traditions through Mary Shelley's Frankenstein.

C.O-V: To examine the emergence of new literary trends dominated by imagination and emotion.

Paper 10: ENG-HC-4036 British Literature: The 19th Century

C.O-I: To familiarise the students with the British literature in the 19th century.

C.O-II: To acquaint the students with the understanding of the age which is remarkable for a range of works, addressing a very diverse array of social preoccupation.

C.O-III: Learn to analyse texts both poetry and novels which exemplify some of the central formal and thematic concerns of the age.

SEMESTER –V

Paper 11: ENG-HC-5016 British Literature: The 20th Century

C.O-I: To familiarise the students with 20th century British literature through the prescribed texts.

C.O-II: To acquaint the students with the understanding of the age as an era modernism.

C.O-III: To introduce the students to the spirit of modernism, with its urgent desire to break with the codes and conventions of the past, experiments with new forms and idioms and its cosmopolitan willingness to open itself up to influences coming from other shores.

C.O-IV: To acquaint the students with the concepts and philosophy of modernity and how it gets voice in European arts and literature.

Paper 12: ENG-HC-5026 Women's Writing
